

The State-wide Equipment Program (SWEP) aims to provide subsidised aids and equipment for Victorian residents who are frail aged and/or with a long term disability. Under this umbrella there are many subprograms that deal with different equipment and client groups including: Domiciliary Oxygen, Contenance Aids, Vehicle Modification Subsidy Scheme (VMSS), Supported Accommodation Equipment Assistance Scheme (SAEAS), Reissue, Repairs, National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS), Child and Adult Aids and Equipment Program (A&EP), Community Equipment Program (CEP), Specialist Equipment Library (SEL) and the Top-up Fund for Children (TFC). Below is a basic breakdown of the achievements each program has made in the month of December 2015. Every month we will provide information about each program.

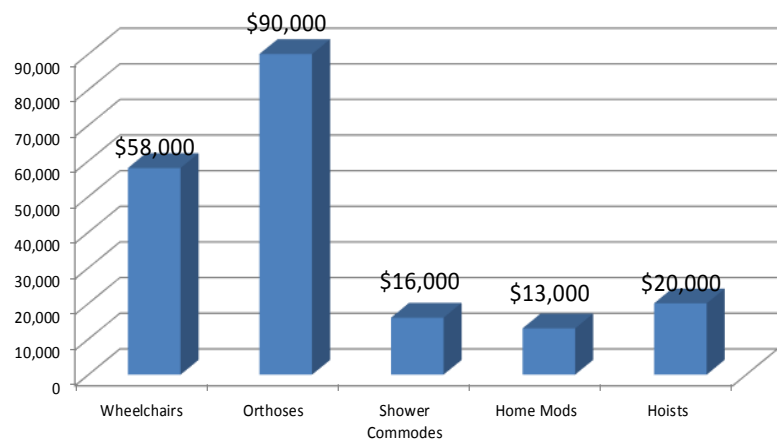

- 3548 clients receiving oxygen

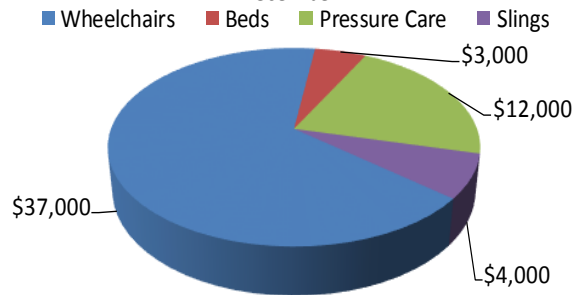
### CONTINENCE

## REISSUE

This month we've reissued 207 Items to 152 unique clients. We currently have 326 reissue-able items in our warehouse and 197 collected items that are pending assessment.

## REPAIRS

Chemtronics conducted 830 visits and repaired 931 items of equipment. Of these repairs 348 were Powered wheelchairs. Powered wheelchairs made up 37% of the repairs.

## VMSS

Allocated over \$80,000 towards modifications.

Majority of modifications were:

- Boot Crane - \$17,000
- Lowered Floor Conversions - \$40,000
- Wheelchair Lifts - \$10,000
