Current Rules





Rules for A&EP – work within state Guidelines

- The program is for assistive technology only
- Funding is not retrospective
- Subsidy levels are fixed
- There is a priority of access to funds related to risk and potential to benefit

Rules for NDIS – work within SWEP/Agency working arrangement

- Clinical work is recognised, must be included in the approved participant's plan and is invoiced directly to the Agency
- Items must satisfy "reasonable and necessary" (R&N) determined by the Agency
- Funding is fully subsidised if it meets the R&N criteria (among others)
- Funding is not retrospective

New Credentialing system



- From November 7, 2016 all **new (unregistered) prescribers** must attend an initial induction held at CQU (Melbourne)
- The session is a full day and for new graduates SWEP provides a subsidy cost to participants is \$270
- Elements included in the session are:
 - Navigation of the SWEP web-site
 - Implications of non-provision and their importance to the probable waiting times (State funding)
 - Concepts of Reasonable and Necessary (NDIS)
 - Mat assessment
 - Risk assessment for equipment including pressure, contractures etc

New Credentialing system





Current Green registered prescribers will remain registered

New Green prescribers must provide proof of qualifications, and registered professions must have AHPRA registration.



Gaining higher recognition



Those with current higher recognition will remain in place.

- To become a new Amber prescriber, prescribers will need to have at least 1 year of experience and provide proof of attendance at a competency based education program.
 - SWEP is funding the development of appropriate education at CQU. A recognition process of other education is in development.
 - SWEP will also audit a minimum of 3 amber scripts to ensure competency.

Gaining higher recognition



Those with current higher recognition will remain in place.

- To become a new Red prescriber, prescribers will need to have at least 5 years of experience and provide proof of attendance at a competency based education program.
 - SWEP is funding the development of appropriate education at CQU. A recognition process of other education is in development.
 - SWEP will also audit a minimum of 3 Red scripts to ensure competency.

On-going professional development



- Every 3 years SWEP will require proof of updated education
- It's anticipated that generic education will cross over equipment categories
