SWEP PERFORMANCE REPORT CARD April 2017




The State-wide Equipment Program (SWEP) aims to provide subsidised aids and equipment for Victorian residents who are frail aged and/or with a long term disability. Under this umbrella there are many subprograms that deal with different equipment and client groups including: Domiciliary Oxygen, Continence Aids, Vehicle Modification Subsidy Scheme (VMSS), Supported Accommodation Equipment Assistance Scheme (SAEAS), Reissue, Repairs, National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS), Child and Adult Aids and Equipment Program (A&EP), Community Equipment Program (CEP) and the Top-up Fund for Children (TFC). Below is a basic breakdown of the achievements each program has made in the month of April 2017. Every month we will provide information about each program.

AIDS & EQUIPMENT CHILDREN

This month we have:

- Processed 96 applications
- Allocated \$160,000 over towards equipment
- Assisted 45 clients with the purchase of 253 items



A&E ADULTS

This month we have:

- Processed 437 applications
- Allocated over \$1,000,000 towards equipment
- Assisted 487 clients with the purchase of 964 items

DOP

This month we have:

- Processed 94 applications
- Allocated over \$400,000
 towards equipment
- 3453 clients receiving
 oxygen

CONTINENCE

This month we have:

- Processed 625 applications
- Allocated over \$220,000 towards continence aids
- 321 clients receiving continence aids

SAEAS

This month we have:

Allocated over \$150,000 towards equipment.

Majority of equipment funded:

- Wheelchairs \$25,000
- Hoists \$11,000
- Pressure Care \$10,000

REISSUE

This month we've reissued 132 items to 114 unique


clients. We currently have 404 reissue-able items

in our warehouse and 52 collected items that are

pending assessment.

REPAIRS

Chemtronics assisted 646 clients and repaired 718 items of equipment. Of these repairs 255 were Powered wheelchairs. Powered wheelchairs made up 36% of the repairs.



SWEP SURVEY RESULTS

This month our results showed (sample size=63):

Satisfaction with SWEP staff: 92%

Satisfaction with prescribers: 93%

Satisfaction with suppliers: 97%

Satisfaction with equipment:97%

Satisfaction with SWEP overall: 90%

NDIS

This month we have:

- Processed 317 applications
- Allocated over \$460,000 towards equipment
- Allocated funding towards 579 items



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
