

SWEP PERFORMANCE REPORT CARD

AUGUST 2019



The State-wide Equipment Program (SWEP) aims to provide eligible consumers with subsidised assistive technology (AT) to enhance independence in their home, facilitate community participation & support families & carer's in their role.

There are many subprograms for different types of AT items including: Aids & Equipment Program (A&EP Adults and Children); Repairs; Continence Aids (CA); Domiciliary Oxygen (DOP); Supported Accommodation Equipment Assistance Scheme (SAEAS); Vehicle Modification Subsidy Scheme (VMSS); Reissue; Lymphoedema Compression Garments Program (LCGP) and Laryngectomy Consumables Program (LCP).

Below is a basic breakdown of the achievements each program has made in the month of August 2019.

A&EP ADULT

This month we have:

- Received 1,218 applications for adults requiring assistance.
- Assisted 445 adults with funding towards their AT items.
- Assisted with the purchase of 632 individual AT items.

A&EP CHILD

This month we have:

- Received 32 applications for children requiring assistance.
- Assisted 29 children with funding towards their AT items.
- Assisted with the purchase of 61 individual AT items.

SAEAS

This month we have:

- Received 7 applications for consumers requiring assistance.
- Assisted 11 consumers with funding towards their AT items.
- Assisted with the purchase of 24 individual AT items.

DOP

This month we have:

- Received 137 applications for consumers requiring assistance.
- Assisted 3,058 consumers receiving oxygen.

CONTINENCE AIDS

This month we have:

- Received 362 applications for consumers requiring assistance.
- Assisted 198 consumers with funding towards their AT items.
- Assisted with the purchase of 1,074 individual AT items.

VMSS

This month we have:

- Received 2 applications for consumers requiring assistance.
- Assisted 5 consumers with funding towards their AT items.
- Assisted with the purchase of 10 individual AT items.

SWEP LCGP

This month we have:

- Received 169 applications for consumers requiring assistance.
- Assisted 98 consumers with funding towards their continence items.
- Assisted with the purchase of 272 individual garments.

LARYNGECTOMY

This month we have:

- Received 7 applications for consumers requiring assistance.
- Assisted 23 consumers receiving laryngectomy consumables.
- The most common consumable purchase this month is Heat Moisture Exchangers.

REPAIRS

Our contracted Supplier for Repairs (Chemtronics) have attended to repairs of 877 AT items.

The most common items repaired this month were Scooters and Manual Wheelchairs.

REISSUE

This month we have reissued 155 refurbished AT items to consumers requiring assistance.

We currently have 1,052 refurbished AT items in our warehouse and have collected 201 AT items that are no longer required and are pending refurbishment.
